The Regulation changes from 1st October 2013 allow Employers greater freedom in choosing a Training Provider and qualifications to meet their identified First Aid requirements.

However an Employer must be satisfied that their Training Provider is competent in First Aid training and has the necessary Quality Assurance processes in place.

The First Aid Industry Body (FAIB), a Trade Body **(an acceptable option for Employers to choose as per HSE Information Sheet, General Information Sheet 3, Paragraph 9)** checks every registered Training Provider to ensure that they will always meet the standards that you (the Employer) need to satisfy your Legal Requirements for First Aid provision as required by the Health & Safety Executive (HSE).

What does FAIB Due Diligence of a Training Provider include?

1 Trainers and Assessors.

HSE Requirement	Do FAIB Registered Training Organisations meet this requirement?
Do the Trainers and Assessors have a current First Aid at Work certificate or are they exempted?	Yes. All FAIB Registered Training Organisations have Trainers and Assessors who are First Aid at Work qualified or are exempted as laid out in the FAIB Administrative Guidance (Version 1-October 2013, Page 8-9) .
Do the Trainers have an appropriate Training Qualification?	Yes. All FAIB Registered Training Organisations will only have Trainers who have an appropriate Training qualification as laid out in the FAIB Administrative Guidance (Version 1-October 2013, Page 8-9) .
Do the Assessors have an appropriate assessing qualification?	Yes. All FAIB Registered Training Organisations will only have Assessors who have an appropriate assessing qualification as laid out in the FAIB Administrative Guidance (Version 1-October 2013, Page 8-9) .

2 Quality Assurance.

HSE Requirement	Do FAIB Registered Training Organisations meet this requirement?
Does the Training Organisation have a documented Quality Assurance Plan designating an individual to take responsibility for Quality Assurance and including at least Annual Assessment of the performance of Trainers and Assessors?	Yes. All FAIB Registered Training Organisations must conform to the FAIB Quality Assurance procedures as laid out in the FAIB Administrative Guidance (Version 1-October 2013, Page 19-20) .
Does the person responsible for Quality Assurance have a current First Aid at Work certificate or is exempted?	Yes All FAIB Registered Training Organisations have a person responsible for Quality Assurance who has a First Aid at Work certificate or is exempted.
Does the responsible person have an assessing/verifying qualification?	Yes. All FAIB Registered Training Organisations have a person responsible for Quality Assurance who has an assessing/verifying qualification.
Is there a documented course evaluation procedure in place?	Yes. All FAIB Registered Training Organisations must have a course evaluation procedure in place as laid out in FAIB Administrative Guidance (Version 1-October 2013, Page 20) .
Is there a documented complaints procedure in place?	Yes. All FAIB Registered Training Organisations must have a course evaluation procedure in place as laid out in FAIB Administrative Guidance (Version 1-October 2013, Page 20)
Is there a documented Premises procedure in place?	Yes. All FAIB Registered Training Organisations must have a premises evaluation procedure in place as laid out in FAIB Administrative Guidance (Version 1-October 2013, Page 10)
Is there a documented Resources procedure in place?	Yes. All FAIB Registered Training Organisations must have a Resources procedure in place as laid out in FAIB Administrative Guidance (Version 1-October 2013, Page 10)

3 Teaching currently accepted First Aid practice.

HSE Requirement	Do FAIB Registered Training Organisations meet this requirement?

4 Training Syllabus.

HSE Requirement	Do FAIB Registered Training Organisations meet this requirement?
Does the course content adequately meet the needs of your workplace as indicated by your first aid needs assessment.	Yes. All FAIB Registered Training Organisations will work closely with their clients (Employers) to ensure that the Training provided meets all your identified First Aid requirements.
For the First Aid at Work course does the syllabus include all the required topics set by the HSE and does the course last at least 18 Training and Assessment contact hours over a minimum of 3 days?	Yes. As shown in the FAIB Administrative Guidance (Version 1-October 2013, Page 12-13).
For the First Aid at Work Requalification course does the syllabus include all the required topics set by the HSE and does the course last at least 12 Training and Assessment contact hours over a minimum of 2 days?	Yes. As shown in the FAIB Administrative Guidance (Version 1-October 2013, Page 13-14.)
For the Emergency First Aid at Work course does the syllabus include all the required topics set by the HSE and does the course last at least 6 Training and Assessment contact hours over a minimum of 1 day?	Yes. As shown in the FAIB Administrative Guidance (Version 1-October 2013, Page 15).
For the First Aid Annual Refresher course does the syllabus include all the required topics set by the HSE and does the course last at least 3 Training and Assessment contact hours over a minimum of 1 day?	Yes. As shown in the FAIB Administrative Guidance (Version 1-October 2013, Page 15).
For the Paediatric First Aid course (England and Wales) does the syllabus include all the required topics as required by Ofsted and does the course last at least 12 Training and Assessment contact hours over a minimum of 2 days?	Yes. As shown in the FAIB Administrative Guidance (Version 1-October 2013, Page 16).
For the Paediatric First Aid course (Scotland) does the syllabus include all the required topics and does the course last at least 6 Training and Assessment contact hours over a minimum of 1 day?	Yes. As shown in the FAIB Administrative Guidance (Version 1-October 2013, Page 16-17).

5 Certificates.

HSE Requirement	Do FAIB Registered Training Organisations meet this requirement?
<p>Do the certificates issued to students trained and assessed as competent include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the name of the Training Provider? • the title of the qualification? • reference to the Health and Safety (First Aid) Regulations 1981? • the date of issue? • confirmation the certificate is valid for 3 years <p>If the training is neither First Aid at Work or Emergency First Aid at Work the certificate should list the syllabus of the course on which students have been trained and assessed.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Yes.</p> <p>All FAIB Registered Training Organisations issue certificates as laid down by the HSE Guidance to the Regulations.</p>
